ABOUT US

CUE is a network of racial justice advocates working across diverse types of civic power as organizers, researchers, artists, storytellers, policymakers, and lawyers to redesign Chicago's civic institutions and transform Chicagoans' relationship to power.

Our community envisions a different future – and builds the blueprint to get there. Through <u>our Fellows'</u> work, we build models for how to shift power in government, philanthropy, research, and other civic institutions. Since 2017, we've garnered national recognition for our work developing <u>people-powered voter guides</u>, <u>participatory budgets</u>, and community-led policymaking strategies.

EXPERIENCE

The Chicago United for Equity (CUE) Fellowship is a yearlong experience for leaders committed to catalyzing civic change in Chicago. Each cohort of 15 - 20 Fellows serve as collective strategists for each other, sharing their diverse perspectives from working in government, media, research, advocacy, organizing, and philanthropy. Together, they build a shared analysis of the city we love, where it must grow to meet our communities' needs, and develop action plans for their own organizations informed by this wider collaboration.

At its core, CUE is a reflective learning community. Over 9 monthly workshops, each cohort explores:



Guiding Principles

Aligning language and core principles in this work, understanding historical precedents, and applying diagnostic tools for interventions.

Foundational Frameworks

For community-led policymaking, including Racial Equity Impact Assessments, decolonized research approaches, and redesigned community engagement practices.

Case Studies

And change strategies that have been successful in past work.

Equity Design Labs

Where Fellows build solutions to real civic challenges in Chicago.



SELECTION CRITERIA

CUE Fellows are innovators, disruptors, and healers of all different kinds. Candidates are evaluated on their individual leadership, project concept, and organizational sponsor. Evaluation is conducted by CUE staff and Fellowship alumni, through a written application and Selection Day, a collaborative scenariobased interview process with other candidates.

FELLOWSHIP PROJECT

Fellows are expected to define a Fellowship Project to reimagine a structure, policy or practice through a racial equity lens. Promising projects develop an approach that has the potential to serve as a new model for the field or sector, and addresses an equity challenge that shifts power in the civic ecosystem.

EXAMPLES OF PAST CUE FELLOW PROJECTS

Shifting Philanthropic Culture

Cultivating a Community of Practice to Expand Racial Equity in Family Foundations. Project centered on developing a new norm by reimagining how family foundations conduct site visits, what they look for in proposals, the types of organizations that are funded, and who makes funding decisions.

From "Color-blind" to Color-bold

A Racial Equity Impact Assessment at Pierce Elementary to ensure students of color receive an excellent education and experience, and become a model for effectively disrupting racism and eliminating school-based racial inequities.

Go Green on Racine

A transit oriented development project to strengthen the transit hub and economic vitality of the 63rd and Racine corridor.

Candidates should name a sponsor organization that will serve as a partner in developing and implementing their Fellowship Projects. Candidates should have a pre-existing relationship with this organization as a staff member, board member or similar leadership role, or as a volunteer or longstanding collaborator.

We fund the CUE Equity
Fellowship in alignment with our
vision for transforming power.
Sponsoring organizations that
have a candidate selected for the
CUE Fellowship contribute to the
cost of the program on a sliding
scale based on the sponsoring
organization's annual operating
budget. Though no qualified
candidate is turned away for
inability to pay, all sponsoring
organizations are required to
commit resources to demonstrate
commitment to their project.
